Ambassador Chas W. Freeman, Jr. is a former U.S. Assistant Secretary of Defense, Ambassador to Saudi Arabia (during operations Desert Shield and Desert Storm), acting Assistant Secretary of State for African Affairs, and Chargé d'affaires at both Bangkok and Beijing. He began his diplomatic career in India but specialized in Chinese affairs. (He was the principal American interpreter for President Nixon's visit to Beijing in 1972.) He remains a frequent visitor to China as well as Arabia.

Ambassador Freeman is a much sought-after public speaker and the author of several books on statecraft and diplomacy. His most recent book on China, Interesting Times: China, America, and the Shifting Balance of Prestige, was published in March 2013. He studied at the Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México and in Taiwan, and earned an A.B. magna cum laude from Yale University as well as a J.D. from the Harvard Law School.

As Chairman of Projects International, Ambassador Freeman has developed new business, arranged international private-sector joint ventures, acquisitions, and other business operations for American and foreign clients.
